1. Welcome and Introductions
2. LCAP Information
  - The Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) is how schools set goals for spending resources to help improve student outcomes. Schools are required to draft a three-year plan and share that plan with stakeholders (staff, parents, and students). The three-year plan is updated and approved by the school board each year.
  - Schools receive money 4 main ways:
    1. Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

The main funding source, which includes base level funding plus additional money to support the academic needs of at-risk groups (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).
    2. State funding
    3. Local funding
    4. Federal funding

How are the funds used?

- Priority 1 – Basic School Services: good facilities and teachers
- •Priority 2 – Implementation of State Standards: approved by CA
- •Priority 3 – Parent Involvement: efforts to seek input and participation
- •Priority 4 – Pupil Achievement: CAASPP, Reclassification, College/Career
- •Priority 5 – Pupil Engagement: attendance, dropout, graduation
- •Priority 6 – School Climate: safe and connected
- •Priority 7 – Access to a Broad Course of Study: A-G and local courses
- •Priority 8 – Other Pupil Outcomes: CTE, Professional Skills, etc.

### Local Priority 3: Parent Involvement

- Vista Real uses the CA Department of Education's self-reflection tools in unison with school surveys to report progress on the local performance indicator to educational partners and the public.
- This self-reflection tool is organized into three sections, rated on a scale from 1 to 5. Each section includes research and evidence-based practices in family engagement:
  1. Building relationships between school staff and families (VR average: 4.25 - Full Implementation)
  2. Building partnerships for student outcomes (VR average: 3.5 - Initial Implementation)
  3. Seeking input for decision-making (VR average: 3.25 - Initial Implementation)

  2. English Learner Re-classification
  3. CTE Enrollment

### Title 1 Part A

- Supplemental federal funds provided to schools with high percentages of children from low-income families to help ensure that all children meet challenging academic standards.
- As a means of measure and reporting, **Vista Real will be using the LCAP in place of the SPSA.** This meets the requirements of data driven analysis that is shared with educational partners.

### CNA (Comprehensive Needs Assessment) for Title 1

- Guided by the WASC Self-Study, CA Dashboard, LCAP, SARC Report, and 2021 CAASPP Data , we found our areas of need to be:
  1. Interventions for reading and math
  2. Supporting post secondary options
  3. Educational Partner engagement
  4. Improving academic performance of EL students
- We saw from the CNA and the LCAP Data report that students are in need of literacy support. With Title 1 Funds this first year, Vista Real has implemented the **Targeted Assistance Program to improve literacy skills.**
